The continuing education required must include information on the following subjects: (1) the nature, extent, and causes of domestic violence; (2) procedures designed to promote the safety of the victim and other household members; (3) resources available to victims and perpetrators of domestic violence; and (4) the lethality of domestic violence.

Virginia	§ 63.2-1612	It shall be the responsibility of the Department to establish minimum standards of training and provide educational programs to train workers in the fields of child and adult protective services in local departments and community based domestic violence programs funded by the Department to identify domestic violence and provide effective referrals for appropriate services.
Washington	§74.14B.010	The identification of domestic violence is critical in ensuring the safety of children in the child welfare system. As a result, ongoing domestic violence training and consultation shall be provided to children's services caseworkers, including how to use the children's administration's practice guide to domestic violence.

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
